COURSE AND HOUSE RULES

Penrith Golf Club is grateful for your patronage. We are very proud of our Golf Course and Clubhouse facilities and are mindful of maintaining them in the best possible condition. Equally important is maintaining high standards of behaviour and golf etiquette.

This document sets out certain rules for maintenance of the Course, and dress requirements on the Course and in the Clubhouse.

- Visitors who are inappropriately dressed **shall not** be allowed to play on the course or enter the premises.
- It is the responsibility of golfers to comply with our dress regulations.
- We strongly suggest that you advise your guests of the dress code before they attend the club.

CARE OF THE COURSE

Sand buckets are available and are to be used for repairs to all divots.

It is compulsory for all golfers to carry and use sand buckets.

Bunkers are to be raked and pitch marks on greens repaired.

Buggies and Electric Carts are not to be taken across or within 10 metres of greens or on tees.

DRESS ON THE COURSE

On the golf course, Members and visitors are to be neatly dressed. It is the responsibility of the Member to ensure their guests are correctly attired.

Acceptable Attire - Men

- Short socks must be either plain white or with a golf club logo. Ankle socks are permissible and should be predominately white.
- Long socks, if worn, must be pulled up at all times.
- Shorts and trousers must be of a tailored style. Shorts must be of a reasonable length but not extending below the knee (3/4 style shorts are not acceptable).
- Shirts must have a collar and must be worn tucked into trousers or shorts at all times. Mock collar golf shirts are permitted as long as they are designed for golf wear.
- Headgear, if worn, must be appropriate and if it has a logo, must only be a golfing logo.
- Regulation non steel spike golf shoes must be worn on the course.

Acceptable Attire – Women

- Shirts must have collars
- Short socks MUST be either plain white or with a golf club logo. Ankle socks are permissible and should be predominately white.
- Shirts may be worn out but must be no longer than 14cm below the waist.
- Headgear, if worn, must be appropriate and if it has a logo, must only be a golfing logo.
- Regulation non steel spike golf shoes must be worn on the course.
- Tailored shorts, tailored slacks, tailored $\frac{3}{4}$ length slacks (mid calf) and skirts

Unacceptable attire at any time

- Denim pants/jeans, shirts and skirts of any colour or those types of jeans bearing brand names or other similar clothing advertising a logo.
- Singlet tops.
- Hawaiian style shirts and other beach type garments.
- Football / Rugby jerseys.
- Rippled style shoes or thongs are not permitted.
- Metal spikes golf shoes.
- Elastic or drawstring waist trousers or shorts.

DRESS IN THE CLUBHOUSE

- In the clubhouse, golfing attire or appropriate casual wear and footwear with socks may be worn.
- Boat shoes are permitted (with or without socks) in the Members bar, locker room and courtyard area.
- Rubber thongs are only permitted until 7pm.
- Singlet tops are not permitted at any time.
- Caps or hats are not permitted in the Clubhouse at any time. You may be asked to shout the bar if you decide to wear a cap or hat in the Clubhouse.

Penrith Golf Club does not accept bad behaviour at any time in the Clubhouse (or golf course). If you are a member and are found to be misbehaving, you will front a disciplinary hearing and face suspension and/or termination of your membership. Non-members will not be accepted in the Clubhouse and will face a life ban.
